

- c. After consultation with the Village Clerk, the Mayor reported that the Village has not yet received payment for the vehicles that were sold to the Village of Floral Park.
7. Deputy Mayor's Report: No report
8. Trustee Driscoll thanked Ann Marie Byrnes for her service on the BZA and welcomed the new members of the Board of Zoning Appeals. He thanked Village Clerk Charles Puglisi for assuming the position after the departure of former Village Clerk Rosaleen Shea.
9. Trustee Dorry reported that the Joint Bellerose Business District Corporation is looking for a volunteer to serve as the Village's representative and added that many of the Village's other committees are seeking additional volunteers.
10. Trustee Woodruff said that her term as Trustee will soon be ending. She said that she has decided not to run for election. She thanked the other members of the Board for their continued service to the Village.
11. Highway Commissioner George Braun: Reported that the maintenance men have been using a product called 'Aquaphalt' for pothole repair over the last few months. Traditional 'cold-patch' is less expensive, but it quickly washes away with rain and its short life makes it more costly in the final analysis. Aquaphalt works with water to cure and harden and will last indefinitely. He added, "We will never catch up with the potholes, but this is a step in the right direction."
12. Fire Commissioner George Braun reported:
 - a. The Bellerose Fire Department's Operations Training has been scheduled at the Nassau County Fire Service Academy. Members of the Bellerose Fire Department will be completing live burn training on four Tuesday evenings in October. The training will focus on live burn scenarios: dwellings, tax payers (commercial properties), garden apartments, and Nassau County bus fires.
 - b. The Bellerose Fire Department hosted the monthly meetings of the Battalion Chiefs and Battalion Delegates Associations.
 - c. He said that engines 107 and 108 were taken out of service for maintenance in preparation for the annual pump tests at the Fire Service Academy. Both engines passed all tests.
 - d. Finally, Chief Braun stated that there was one call to 247-40 Jericho Turnpike for burning food on the stove. Seven members responded to the call.
13. Police Commissioner Tamparo:
 - a. Reported that the monthly report from the Third Precinct has not been received. He said that Officer Brown of the Third Precinct, when called by the Village Clerk, reported that there were no auto accidents, aided cases, burglaries, robberies, or criminal mischief during the month of January.
 - b. He reminded those in attendance that all citizens must do their part for there to be good policing. He advised residents to call the police if they see anything suspicious.
14. Mayor Moore moved to close the business meeting at 8:35 PM. Deputy Mayor Juliano seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.
15. Mayor Moore opened the meeting to the public.
 - a. Mary Kelly raised the issue that Bellerose Village is not a participant in the Advisory Board on Belmont which was formed by Assembly member Solanges

and NY State Senator Kaplan. Mayor Moore said that he would raise the matter in his upcoming meeting with Senator Kaplan.

16. Mayor Moore motioned to close the meeting at 8:37 PM. Trustee Driscoll seconded the motion, which was unanimously carried.
